



Message from the Mayor

The Covid 19 Pandemic is changing the way we live in Sunset Hills and St. Louis County daily. This is an update on what Sunset Hills is doing. Keep in mind things can change at any time and I encourage all residents to stay tuned to local news, State and County web sites.

The City of Sunset Hills is constantly monitoring directions given by the Office of the County Executive, the Governor and the President. The "Stay at Home/Shelter in Place" Policy is being followed. Important exceptions to those guidelines are our First Responders, including police and firefighters/ems personnel, who are available 24 hours a day. Healthcare, Pharmacy, Grocery and other businesses, such as Hardware Stores, Banks, Food Services and Construction Sites. Of course, Social Distancing is being practiced. Check each business' website for hours of operation.

The City of Sunset Hills is following the guidelines that most Cities are adhering to. Our public facilities remain closed, except by appointment. City employees are working daily at City Hall and can be reached from 8:30 to 5:00 at 314-849-3400. Additional information is on our website sunset-hills.com.

City parks are closed as of 4/3/2020. This is to protect everyone. Mail and trash service continues at this time.

City business is still being conducted, including bids, bill payment, outdoor inspections and Public Works projects. All court proceedings have been cancelled until further notice. All City meetings are postponed until further notice. Please continue to check our website for updates.

The City is facing a reduction of revenue with so many businesses shut down. We have postponed all major projects and purchases until we can access the fiscal impact to our City. Many local businesses are still open, including restaurants with takeout and/or delivery. Please shop local whenever possible.

Our police officers are not stopping people asking why they are out but instead are relying on our residents support to comply. Help keep our community safe and help us get through this as quickly as possible. Our police officers are working with businesses and individuals to prevent gatherings of people. It is okay to walk your dog, take walks or bike rides but please practice **social distancing**.

We are fortunate to live in this great city, and I am proud to be your Mayor. Let's cooperate and get through this crisis together. We will bounce back stronger and prouder than ever if we work together through this. Our actions are helping to save lives.
