Mayor's Memo March 2008

As many of you are already aware, the City of Sunset Hills has made some changes regarding the residential waste collection of trash and recyclables. Some changes were mandated in order to meet the revised St. Louis County's Waste Management Code ordinances that regulate incorporated municipalities. Other changes were the result of long term strategic planning for the community of Sunset Hills.



What was required per County Ordinance?

All one and two family residential dwellings throughout Sunset Hills must have as a minimum level of service the following:

- Once per week solid waste (trash)
- Once per week recycling
- Twice per year bulky item

These three minimum service level requirements must be included in the base rate that all residents must pay.

How did the City of Sunset Hills implement these requirements?

The City elected to provide a *required* two-year notification to all haulers in the region that in 2010, Sunset Hills *may* establish one residential waste collection company to serve the entire municipality.

In the interim, the City has a license agreement with haulers that meet the minimum County Ordinance requirements. These haulers are Allied Waste, Veolia, American Eagle, IESI, and Waste Management. Their rates have been included in previous newsletters for your reference and this information can be found on the City's website at: <http://www.sunset-hills.com>

You may ask why Sunset Hills would explore the option of contracting with just one hauler for our community like many other municipalities in St. Louis County do. There are several viable reasons, such as decreased wear and tear of our City's roadway network and lower costs.

With only one waste collection company, the number of times that a truck drives down your street will decrease significantly. This also decreases the potential for property damage and can clearly establish who is accountable if damage does occur. A second viable reason is the cost for the residents. If the City bids out an exclusive contract with one hauler, the rates will decrease because the hauler will have a guaranteed client base of over 3000 homes. Other benefits of an exclusive hauler include the increased eligibility of Grant funding to assist with waste reduction and recycling.

Recycling – the economic side

Although many of you already recycle, the day is coming where recycling may become mandatory. The landfills are filling up quickly, and as fuel costs increase, the cost to dispose of solid waste is on the rise. These factors strongly suggest that now is the time to begin recycling efforts, if you have not already.

Sunset Hills Golden Anniversary Celebration Closes the Books Makes donation for parks equipment for special needs children



The Sunset Hills Golden Anniversary Celebration, a non-profit founded to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the founding of Sunset Hills, announced today that it was dissolving after a successful year of celebration.

"We are thrilled by the generosity of Sunset Hills residents," said Mayor John Hunzeker. He continued, "Not only were we able to have a successful year of events and celebrations that marked our founding, in closing the books today we are donating \$50,000 to purchase playground equipment for special needs children."

The equipment will be installed at Watson Trail Park by Game Time Playground Equipment, a playground equipment manufacturer. Construction is expected to be completed in four to six weeks depending on weather.

MUNICIPAL ELECTION

Tuesday, April 8, 2008 is Municipal Election Day in Sunset Hills. Brett Syberg has withdrawn his candidacy for Alderman Ward 4 and his name has been removed from the ballot.

Severe Weather

Everyone should have a basic knowledge of severe weather safety rules. Know the difference between a WATCH and a WARNING. A Watch means, "Watch" the sky. Conditions are right for tornadoes!

Watch A Tornado Could Happen.

A Warning means that a Tornado has been sighted or appears on Radar.

TAKE COVER

On the road: Leave your car. Get inside a building or lie flat in a ditch or ravine. Never take cover under your car

At home: Go to your basement or an interior room on the lowest floor, a closet or bathroom with no windows.

Outside: Take cover in a ditch or ravine. Stay below ground level if possible; stay away from water and never take cover under a tree.

This is a good time of the year to review your family's disaster plan. Remember knowing what to do is your best protection in any dangerous situation. Since the family is not together 24 hours a day, the first thing a family needs to plan for is how will you find each other if parents are at work, children are at school or a home on vacation. The key is to have a plan. Follow the steps to create and implement a plan.

1. Become aware of hazards possible in your area and the community's warning signals, ask about your workplace and your children's school disaster plan.
2. Pick a meeting place outside your home, in case of fire, have one outside your neighborhood in case you cannot return to your home.
3. Ask an out of state friend or relative to be your family contact for everyone to call if the family gets separated. All family members should carry this telephone number.
4. Teach basic safety measures, how to dial 911, post important telephone numbers, how to turn off water, gas, and electricity at the main switches. Do you know CPR and First Aid.? Can you use a fire extinguisher, do you have your escape routes and safe spots designated in your home?
5. Compile a family disaster supply kit. Be sure to include, a battery powered radio, flashlight and extra batteries, water, canned food, first aid kit, blankets, and all those special need items.

The State of Missouri and FEMA have websites that contain valuable information on preparing for emergencies and publications to order. The police department has a limited number of publications from FEMA available.

Today's technology allows for all recyclables to be placed in one container for the waste collector to pick up. Once a recycle truck is full, it is taken to a recycling facility where it is mechanically separated with methods such as vibrating conveyor belts and magnetic arms for metal separation. These products are then resold. As you can see, recycling can also decrease your costs in the long term! Unlike solid waste delivery to landfills, which can cost the hauler over \$30 per load, there is a return investment at a recycling facility where the hauler gets paid a few dollars for every delivered load.



Public Safety Committee

As a result of the tragic events in Kirkwood, the Mayor called for the creation of the Public Safety Committee. He said "Each resident attending a public meeting has a reasonable expectation of safety. Residents of Sunset Hills will determine if existing policies, procedures and practices meet that expectation." To formalize the discussion, the Board of Aldermen approved a recommendation by a vote of 5-3 to establish a Public Safety Committee. It will consist of four residents, one from each ward. The purpose of the committee is to evaluate safety policies, procedures and practices in our municipal meetings and buildings.

The following residents have been chosen to serve on the Public Safety Committee. Ted Rohr of Ward 4 will serve as Chairman. Members of the committee are Tony Grasso of Ward 1, Bill Hopfinger of Ward 3 and George Neimeyer of Ward 2. Residents, city employees and elected officials are encouraged to share their thoughts about safety and security at three separate public meetings. Meeting times to solicit opinions from residents, elected officials and staff have been established.

Meetings for resident input are scheduled for Thursday April 10, 2008 at 3:30 p.m. and Wednesday April 16, 2008 at 6:30 p.m. If you are unable to attend a meeting, please submit your written concern or opinion to The Public Safety Committee, 3939 S.
