Winter Driving Safety Tips

There are certain precautions that all motorists should take to help with the challenges of driving during winter weather conditions. Before a winter storm hits, check your vehicle's liquids such as washer fluid and anti-freeze. In addition, test your wiper blades; they should be able to clear your windshield of snow, rain, sand and salt. Be sure that your car has plenty of gas to get you safely to your destination or to a gas station to re-fuel.

Before you put your vehicle in drive, make sure all windows and side mirrors are clear of any snow or ice that may have fallen while your vehicle was parked. The few minutes it takes to clear your windows could potentially save your life. You should also clear as much snow as possible off the roof to prevent it from flying off and striking another vehicle which could result in damage or cause an accident.

If possible, stay home, or keep travel to a minimum. If you do drive, anticipate delays, especially during the rush-hour commute. Before you go out on the roads, clear snow and ice from your vehicle, including your tail-lights, headlights and roof. As always, buckle up for safety. Allow extra space between your vehicle and the vehicle in front of you to allow extra distance for stopping. Watch for black ice and be aware that bridge surfaces tend to freeze more quickly and remain frozen longer than other road surfaces. Turn headlights on to increase your visibility. Consider keeping a fully charged cell phone pre-programmed with emergency numbers with you while driving. If your vehicle becomes disabled, dial 911 to report your location and the nature of the emergency.

Every vehicle should be fully stocked with an emergency kit. This kit should include the following items: spare tire, jumper cables, shovel, flashlight, flares, ice scraper, brush, blanket and additional warm clothing; hat, coat, gloves, and warm footwear. If an emergency situation should arise pull over as far to the right as possible and activate your car's hazard lights.

Winter weather driving can be very dangerous, but if you prepare yourself and your vehicle you will greatly increase your chances of arriving at your destination safely.

Historical Society Spotlight

Happy Birthday Ken Luttrell!

We pause our series on building arts to celebrate the 101th birthday of long-time Sunset Hills resident Ken Luttrell. Luttrell was a decorated veteran from World War II and recently shared his experiences with the Historical Society staff. Here are the amazing details of his service in the Pacific arena.

Sgt. Ken Luttrell was born in St. Louis in January 1924 and graduated in 1942 from Brentwood High School where he ran track. Sgt. Luttrell enlisted in the Marine Corps to join his friends. After being inducted in December 1942 at the Old Mark Building, he completed basic training at the Marine Corps base in San Diego. Three months later, Sgt. Luttrell completed radio school and was assigned to the 1st JASCO (Joint Assault Signal Company).

On December 17, 1943, Sgt. Luttrell in the radio squad of Team 2.2 (1st JASCO, 4th Marine Division) pursued maneuvers along the west coast on USS Elmore. On February 1, 1944, his squad stormed the beaches (third wave) of Roi-Namur. Sgt. Luttrell first felt the impact of battle when naval gunfire exploded a Japanese pillbox filled with ammo that sent large chunks of concrete flying 400 yards into an assault force landing craft. On Roi-Namur, Sgt. Luttrell managed communications rather than directing naval gunfire. In late May they departed for Saipan for the invasion on June 16, 1944. Sgt. Luttrell's squad were in the second wave of the invasion. On Saipan, Sgt. Luttrell directed devastating naval gunfire from the battleships Texas and California and directed "star shells" to illuminate the sky during several nocturnal banzai attacks. He lost several Marine buddies in Saipan and witnessed the suicide of civilians who threw themselves off of Marpi point cliff based on false propaganda of Marine savagery. On July 24, Sgt. Luttrell's squad was in the first wave of the invasion of Tinian 9 miles away. Sgt. Luttrell remembers blowing up a post-office filled with invasion money and during the rainy first evening, he covered his foxhole with corrugated metal to prevent entry of shrapnel.

The 4th Marine Division then embarked on their voyage to participate in the infamous invasion of Iwo Jima on February 19, 1944. Sgt. Luttrell's team was on the first wave of the amphibious assault of yellow beach with Motoyama airfield as their objective. The team inched forward on yellow beach and in the valley between Mt. Surabachi and the airfield, through frequent artillery shelling from large guns embedded into the mountain which transversed at various levels for each bombardment. Sgt. Luttrell was able to direct naval gunfire on the second day to specific targets. At 7:00 a.m. on the third day (February 21) as he was setting up a 20ft. naval telescoping radio antenna, Sgt. Luttrell was hit at high velocity by a piece of shrapnel that ripped through his left cheek and exited out his right cheek. Although semi-conscious and without vision, he struggled to get to the beach with the assistance of Cpt. John "Johnny" Johnson who used semaphore flags to call in a boat. After being strapped down on a stretcher and loaded onto a landing craft, Sgt. Luttrell nearly

they offered outdoor plants. Eighty-percent of the hospitals in the area were their customers, and the landscapers. Luttrell was good friends with Vernon Rowe of W.A. Rowe Floral, a neighboring business. He owned and operated Sunset Plantland for 32 years.

Luttrell's charge to Americans is to strive to keep our country great and to preserve liberty. Sgt. Luttrell was awarded the Purple Heart, Combat Action Ribbon, Presidential Unit Citation, American Campaign Medal, Asian-Pacific Campaign ribbon with four bronze stars, WWII Victory Medal and rifle sharpshooter badge.

Happy 101st Birthday, Ken Luttrell! Sunset Hills and the country are so honored to have you in our community.

drowned in his own blood until he managed to flip himself onto his stomach, allowing the blood to drain out of his airway.

Sgt. Luttrell was taken to Saipan on the USS Solace and then to Hawaii on a PBY2Y. He required nine operations to rebuild his facial bones in four separate hospitals with the initial operations performed by a fellow St. Louisan, Dr. Guerdan Hardy, an ENT specialist. He was honorably discharged on November 21, 1945, at Great Lakes Naval Station.

Luttrell was in the hospital, recovering from his injuries and operations, for ten months. He got married while he was still in the hospital, although he had been discharged, and subsequently had a daughter.

Luttrell was employed as a stereotype for twenty years and then opened a nursery, Sunset Plantland, in Sunset Hills in 1966. During an interview for his 100th birthday, he was alert, mentally precise, eloquent and knowledgeable. He explained that running Plantland was labor intensive and required long hours (twelve hours a day, seven days a week); each plant needed to be nurtured and cared for. They carried mostly seasonal plants. They had a couple of greenhouses, some tropicals, but primarily

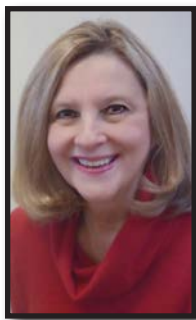
